#### **ASCA SEEKS REVIEWERS**

ASCA Seeks Reviewers for ASCA National Recognition for School Counselor Preparation Programs:

School counseling faculty are encouraged to volunteer as reviewers of programs seeking national recognition. ASCA's recognition is available to universities accredited by the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation (CAEP) or the Association for Advancing Quality in Educator Preparation (AAQEP). Reviewers assess programs based on a written program report that details evidence programs meet the ASCA Standards for School Counselor Preparation Programs. Programs are reviewed twice per year. #### RESEARCH

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has released the first collection of the <u>Youth Risk Behavior Survey</u> since the start of the pandemic. The results are alarming:

- Nearly three in five U.S. teen girls experienced persistent feelings of sadness or hopelessness in 2021 — double that of boys and the highest levels reported in a decade.
- LGBTQ+ youth were substantially more likely to have experienced all forms of violence and had worse mental health outcomes than their heterosexual peers.
   While all teens reported increasing mental health challenges, experiences of violence and suicidal thoughts and behaviors, CDC's new data indicates females and LGBTQ+ students fared worse than their male or heterosexual peers in 2021.
- Youth experienced high and worsening levels of persistent sadness or hopelessness across all racial and ethnic groups and reported suicide attempts increased among Black and white youth.

#### CODE OF CONDUCT

ASCA shared a copyright policy included in social media guidance in fall of 2022.
