FEDERAL ADVOCACY

ASCA joined more than 1,000 organizations on a letter calling on Congress to fully appropriate the necessary nondefense discretionary funds to keep pace with rising costs.

ASCA signed on to a letter sent to the House appropriators to fund the STOP School Violence Act.
