On Sept. 16, the ASCA School Counselor Educator Affinity Group hosted a virtual event: "Building Community for New School Counselors and Grad Students. The purpose was to help those new to the school counseling profession navigate the early stages of their career. Participants had the opportunity to ask questions and get support from seasoned professionals while also networking and connecting with peers who may be experiencing similar situations. 60 people participated in the event.

COLLABORATION

On Sept. 10, Angie Hickman participated in the ASAE Research Foundation WorldCafé. This event focused on defining success criteria for 21st-century associations, rethinking established practices and capturing ideas to build a supportive community of change leaders.

The U.S. Department of Education launched the <u>Attendance Champions</u> <u>Challenge</u>, designed to increase student attendance and more fully support engagement so students and families feel connected to their school community. All Attendance Champions Challenge entrants will receive a certificate of participation from the department and may be invited to highlight their innovative approaches at future webinars, convenings and other activities hosted by the department. The challenge closes on Nov. 30 at 9 p.m. EST.

On Sept. 21, 2024, Dr. Jill Biden hosted a back-to-school event at the White House for educators. ASCA invited Vicky Campbell, Maureen Ponce and Sheila Barnhart-Ramirez, school counselors in Virginia and Maryland, to participate in the event on the South Lawn.

On Sept. 24, Jill participated as a panelist at the Center for American Progress' <u>10th Annual Gun Violence Prevention Summit</u> about investing in school-based personnel and community partnerships to promote safe schools.

CASEL released its newest report, <u>"Social and Emotional Learning in U.S.</u> <u>Schools: Findings from CASEL's Nationwide Policy Scan and the American</u> <u>Teacher Panel and American School Leader Panel Surveys.</u>" The report builds on the body of evidence that indicates well-implemented social/emotional learning (SEL) programs improve academic, and social/emotional outcomes for students and educators and shows more schools across the U.S. are incorporating SEL into students' educational experiences.
