## <u>APPLICATION FOR FUNDING: FAFSA STUDENT SUPPORT</u> <a href="mailto:strategy">STRATEGY</a>

A S50 million program is part of the FAFSA Student Support Strategy to help districts, states, nonprofits and other public and private organizations with efforts to boost FAFSA completion. The program will be implemented by ECMC to support organizations with demonstrated experience in expanding college access and enrollment. The funding will be prioritized for organizations currently working with schools and districts and those that have deep ties with students and families that have the reach and capacity to help decrease barriers and increase FAFSA submissions. It will also facilitate FAFSA submission clinics, including through partnerships with schools and districts, and provide transportation support as needed.

#### **Schedule**

States/Territories may send as many participants as they wish to LDI and Delegate Assembly and may be submitted via the <u>State/Territory Request Form</u>, due May 15.

There is no cost to attend this meeting, but all participants must be an active ASCA member at the time of the event.

Each SCA will designate the two voting delegates for Delegate Assembly. Each voting delegate is required to be an ASCA Professional or Retired member as outlined by ASCA Bylaws and Policies. All other participants are considered non-voting delegates.
